As such, any failure by plaintiff or any employee to take a 1 meal or rest period as provided by company policy was caused by the employee's decision about 2 when to take the meal or rest period or how long of a meal or rest period to take. 3 FOURTH AFFIRMATIVE DEFENSE 4 (Third and Fourth Causes of Action) 5 (Estoppel) 6 The third and fourth causes of action premised upon failure to provide timely, duty-free 7 meal and rest periods are barred by the doctrine of estoppel, as IES has lawful policies and 8 procedures for meal and rest periods. As such, any failure by plaintiff or any employee to take a meal or rest period as provided by company policy was caused by the employee's decision about 10 when to take the meal period or how long of a meal period to take, and the employee is estopped 11 from now seeking damages or penalties based on his or her own decision. 12 <u>FIFTH AFFIRMATIVE DEFENSE</u> 13 (Eighth Cause of Action) 14 (Failure to Exhaust) 15 Plaintiff's eighth cause of action is barred because plaintiff did not comply with all the 16 statutory requirements for bringing such claims, as he did not provide sufficient written notice by 17 certified mail to the Labor and Workforce Development Agency and IES describing the facts and 18 theories to support the alleged violations, as required. WHEREFORE, IES prays:

- 1. That plaintiff be denied relief by way of his Complaint;
- 2. That plaintiff's Complaint be dismissed;
- 3. That IES be dismissed with its costs of suit and attorneys' fees; and
- 4. For such and other relief as the Court deems proper.
